


Fig. 2. University Library, Navsari Agricultural University, Navsari budget During last Five years




Fig. 3. Item wise allocation by University Library, Navsari Agricultural University, Navsari budget During last Five years




Fig. 4. Item wise details of allocation during the year 2020-21




Fig. 5. Item wise details of allocation during the year 2021-22




Fig. 6. Item wise details of allocation during the year 2022-23




Fig. 7. Item wise details of allocation during the year 2023-24




Fig. 8. University Library, Navsari Agricultural University, Navsari library users During last Five years
